Along with needed texts students are expected to have the following for each class period: Blue/Black ballpoint only pens, Red pen, Supply of loose leaf college ruled Paper, 1 ½ in binder with dividers, 2-Single Subject Spiral Notebook, Ruled Index Cards, Highlighters, Glue Sticks, Scissors, Markers, Highlighters.

Students should be prepared for each class by having their materials on hand. If students do not have the needed materials they will have points deducted from their responsible behavior grade.

Curriculum: ELA includes Vocabulary, Reading/Literature, and Grammar/Writing and the report card grade will be reflective of these content areas.

Literature: We will read several novels, poetry, short stories, and informational texts throughout the year. Written analyses of the texts, and other assessments, essays, and projects will accompany our reading.

Vocabulary: Student writing is benefited by the study of words and their meanings. Twenty vocabulary words will be introduced bi-weekly. A test will follow each unit assessing comprehension and understanding how words are used in context.

Grammar: Knowledge of grammar and language mechanics are essential in developing mastery in writing. Students will study grammar and mechanics including correct punctuation, capitalization, word usage, sentence structure, and the parts of speech.

Writing: Students will learn and practice different types of writing: creative, expository, narrative, descriptive and persuasive. Students will support a claim with evidence from a text, integrate and analyze quotes, and cite sources using MLA format. All work turned in should be completed in blue or black ink (ballpoint pen only, no felt-tip or gel pen), or typed if indicated.

Typed papers will follow MLA format. This will include the following:

- 12 point font
- double space between every line on the paper, including heading and title
- Times New Roman or Arial
- proper heading on the left side (your name, my name, subject, date)
- title centered, no underline or different fonts
- black ink only
- works cited page with proper citations when applicable

Grading/Report Cards: You are not “given” grades; you earn them! Grades reflect your hard work throughout the trimester. Extra credit assignments for the sole purpose of raising a trimester grade will not be offered. It is up to the students to keep track of their grades throughout the trimester. Students should meet with the teacher to discuss any questions concerning grades within a week of a grade posting to FACTS.

Formal grades are given on report cards. In middle school, grades 6, 7, 8 students and their parents may access grades online through FACTS, which will be updated on every other Monday. Missing assignments will generate an automatic email notification.

The report card grade will reflect the following:

English Language Arts (includes the study of literature, vocabulary, grammar, and writing)

Participation, IXL, Homework	10%
Assessments and Tests	25%
Essays/Projects	30%
Classwork	35%

Absences: You will have 1 day per day of excused absences to turn in assignments (illness or family emergency). Please note that long term illnesses that last over three days may require a doctor’s note. Vacations and competitions are not considered excused absences.

Homework assignments, tests and upcoming projects or essays will be posted in the classroom and on FACTS. **Daily in-class work may not be posted** and students will be responsible to make sure they keep track of in-class assignments as classwork will be 35% of the grade.

Missing and Late Assignments: ***Late work: Any late classwork or homework assignments will receive no more than 50% if completed within three days past the due date.**

Academic Dishonesty: Student work must be authentic. Students will receive a zero on any work that is copied or plagiarized from another student or source, including internet sources and AI generated. Students will be reminded that they must cite information that is copied or paraphrased. (Changing a few words or phrases is still considered plagiarism.) Academic dishonesty may result in consequences other than receiving a zero as stated in the Parent-Student Handbook.

Planners and Homework: Every student will be given a Nativity School planner for

recording assignments in each class. We are stressing the use of the planner throughout middle school to help the students stay organized and on task.

Homework assignments, tests and upcoming projects or essays will be posted to Schoolspeak. Daily in-class work may not be posted and students will be responsible to make sure they keep track of in class assignments as classwork will be 30% of the grade.
